



## 123ICT's Seasonal Greetings Competition is here!



Welcome to 123ICT's Seasonal Greetings Competition for 2019. This year, we have divided this usually very popular annual challenge in to two separate competitions:

- **KS1.** To create a seasonal greetings card which could be sent out to friends or family; using graphics for the illustration and adding text to create a cheery message.
- **KS2.** Using Scratch to create an animated greetings message that could be augmented by audio.

**The idea, for both competitions, is for the children to deliver a cheery seasonal message (KS1 in the form of a card, KS2 in the form of a Scratch animation) which could be used to convey seasonal greetings to friends or family.**

This is the second of our new-style competitions and will attract points towards our fabulous new '**123ICT Computing Champions League**'. The submitting schools for each competition will be awarded the following league points:

- First Place – 60 Points
- Second Place – 40 Points
- Third Place – 20 Points

In addition, each school that enters the competition will be awarded 10 points and the first, second and third places will also receive certificates.

We will maintain and publish the league table throughout the year and at the end of the year, we will present, in addition to a Computing Champions League winners trophy, a very desirable prize to the winning school. The runner-up school will also receive an excellent prize and runners-up trophy. The prizes are currently being sought from our suppliers and full details will be announced on our competitions blog towards the middle of the academic year.

**KS1 Competition.** KS1 children should create their seasonal greetings card using any graphics program. In addition to an illustration - which should be drawn using the graphics program and not be merely an imported image - A cheery seasonal message should be inserted as text into the illustration.

**KS2 Competition.** KS2 children should use Scratch to create an animated greetings message that could be augmented by audio. Whilst many examples exist on the Scratch website that may be adapted for use as entries, straight copies of these examples should not be submitted. The idea is to create an original animated cheery seasonal message.

## Competition Guidelines

- These competitions are intended for both **Key Stage One and Two children**, including age appropriate entries from special needs schools.
- Each **123ICT** school is entitled to submit one entry per year group to each competition.
- As usual, judging of all entries for our competitions will be carried out by the **123ICT** team, calling upon any additional expertise necessary to assist in that judgement.
- The winning entries, along with all other submissions, will be published on our website <http://www.123ict.co.uk> and will also be notified to our schools during the Spring Term.
- Entries should be e-mailed as attachments to [competitions@123ict.co.uk](mailto:competitions@123ict.co.uk). A reply e-mail will be sent to all submitting schools to confirm receipt.
- **Closing date:** the end of the Autumn Term. Entries from schools that are using the **123SOW** can be submitted at any time but if they are received after the closing date for the current year, they will be entered into the following year's competition.
